This month is so full of happenings that it seems *apropos* to talk about them, and not wax too philosophic. But first, I can mention a little about what's happened here to help create all this activity.

As I'm sure you know by now, the shelter organization that had its home here for so many years closed its doors in December. Their work was taken on by North Side Housing, which continues to operate the interim housing program for men in lower-level Anderson Hall, and we hear good reports about them.

The National Pastime Theater moved into the beautiful Mason Hall on the fourth floor, and hosted a production of the play, "Tunnel Rat" in April – I hope you heard about it and got a chance to see this small gem about the Viet Nam war.

In addition, the Preston Bradley Center now has an Artist in Residence, Colette Wright Adams, who is directing and curating spaces on the 4th and 3 ½ floors as the Uptown Arts Center.
